**REMEMBERING BAHUGUNA/ IN THE WAKE OF UTTARAKHAND TRAGEDY**

Born on 8 January 1937, Sunderlal Bahuguna in Tihar, Uttarakhnad was an environmentalist and Chipko Movement leader. He started social activities in the age of fifteen, under the guidance of Shri Dev Sumari and was closely associated with Gandhiji. He fought against irresponsibility and later started organizing hill women in anti-logging drive from 1983 to 1985. Bahuguna's environmental people against natural misdeeds. King Girdharji married Vishi Ji with the condition to live with rural people and establish ashram in village. He participated in the Independence Movement and was subsequently a part of 'Vishwa Sarvodaya Movement'. He celebrated January 26 and August 15 as festivals and observed a fast on Ashoka Day. He walked through Himalayas from north to south covering more than 4700 km on foot, observed the damage done by large development projects and insisted that the rights be reported to the forest officials.

Chipko movement was started on 20 March 1974. The first cause of movement was reckless cutting of trees in 1974 in the upper reaches of Uttarakhand by timber merchants. From Rauni village, the movement spread to other villages as women hugged trees to protect them. Bahuguna gave a national voice to the movement. His slogan was "Ecology is permanent economy". Young men took on such a task to protect nature. Women led and forest activists took on a similar function. The movement inspired world's attention towards devastation caused by the commercial cuts in the world's highest mountains. The movement led to the Uttarakhand in national attention. The message Ecology and eco-system are important messages.

Later he spread the Asha Tree then particularly big trees movement from 1980 to early 2000. He used biological methods. League strikers of banks of Bhagirathi. He had a record of 71 day long fast. His attention was given to Wang PG for promoting Himalayan region forests in the Uttarakhand high court, Supreme Court and National Green Tribunal. His work of Tihar Bin resumed in 2008. He went to Kullu then shifted to Dehradun and finally to Dehra Dun on 24 May 2012 at Haridwar.

Bahuguna is recipient of Padma Shri, Padma Vibhushan, High Levelhood Award, National High Award and Honorary Doctorate from Banarasi. Award by premier an India Environment, Style & Health, Environment Crisis and Risks at Asia Pacific for action. Asia Young Asia Award, Parvati Puraskar K.O. (Kann) in Padma, he is awarded as 'Gandhi Warrior' and 'A Guard of the Ecology of the Himalayas'. Taking inspiration from his 241 activities in Himalaya, he had more than 1000 km in 5000 trees from being used for a metro railway. Bahuguna's Endless generation of the movement will be remembered as a movement of the people.

In Bahuguna's Uttarakhand, tragedy in February 2013 some natural has its region are in an uncontrolled development and logging activities. A massive death of life and forest and lands were being a glacier in the high Himalayas and led into a lake. The reservoir around the lake collapsed. Guidelines - Code of Conduct Monitoring Committee

Composition and Responsibilities

UGC expects that whosoever adopts teaching as a profession has the obligation to conduct himself/herself in accordance with the ideal of the profession. A teacher is constantly under scrutiny of his/her student as well as society. Therefore, it is expected that there should be no incompatibility between the precepts and practice followed by the teachers. The national ideals of the education which the teacher has to inculcate in the students must be his/her own ideals. Accordingly following the Code of conduct designed by UGC as well as RTM Nagpur University, the institution drafted its standard code of conduct to be followed by Teachers, Students and Administrative Staff. To monitor whether the code of conduct is strictly adhered to, an independent Code of Conduct Monitoring Committee is set up in the college. The composition and responsibilities of the same are as follows:

• **Composition:**

The Code of Conduct Monitoring Committee shall compose of 6 members-Committee with the Principal as its Chairman.

1. Principal: Chairman
2. Vice-Principal: Member
3. IQAC Coordinator: Member
4. IQAC Co-coordinator: Member
5. Librarian: Member
6. Office superintendent / Office-In-Charge: Member

**Meetings:** 02 Meetings

(1<sup>st</sup> Meeting – Before Diwali vacation, 2<sup>nd</sup> Meeting - Before the end of Academic Session)

**Responsibilities:**

**a) Monitoring Code of Conduct of the Students:**

1. The IQAC Coordinator and IQAC Co-coordinator shall see to it that the Code of Conduct is strictly adhered to by the students. In case of breach of the code of conduct by any of the students, she will be directed to her Mentor. The Mentor will counsel the student and will report to the IQAC Coordinator. If no improvement is seen in the behaviour of the erring



student even after the period of 15 days from the day of counselling, she will be warned by the IQAC Coordinator. In case of repetitive negligence for the period of 15 days further, the parents/guardians of the student will be contacted and matters will be discussed with them by the IQAC Coordinator and the Mentor. If still the code of conduct is not followed, the matter will be referred to the Principal who shall caution the erring student. In case, the problem still persists for 1 month, Transfer Certificate (T.C.) will be issued.

**b) Monitoring Code of Conduct of the Staff:**

2. The Office Superintendent or Office-In-Charge shall keep vigil on the office staff members. In case of breach of the code of conduct by any of the members of the office staff, he/she will be warned (in writing, if suitable) by the Office Superintendent or Office-In-Charge. In case of repetitive negligence, the matter will be referred to the principal who shall caution the erring member. In case, the problem persists, the matter will be put forth to the Committee. If the erring member does not pay heed to the instructions given by the Committee for the period of one month from the date of meeting of the Monitoring Committee, Memo will be issued.

3. The Librarian shall monitor the library-staff. In case of breach of the code of conduct by any of the members, he/she will be warned (in writing, if suitable) by the Librarian. In case of repetitive negligence, the matter will be referred to the Principal who shall caution the erring member. In case, the problem persists, the matter will be put forth to the Committee. If the erring member does not pay heed to the instructions given by the Committee till the period of one month from the date of the meeting of Monitoring Committee, Memo will be issued.

4. The Vice-Principal shall oversee that the Code of Conduct is strictly followed by the Teaching staff. In case of breach of the code of conduct by any of the teachers, he/she will be warned (in writing, if suitable) by the Vice-Principal. In case of repetitive negligence, the matter will be referred to the Principal who shall caution the erring member. In case, the problem persists, the matter will be put forth to the Committee. If the erring member does not pay heed to the instructions given by the Committee for the period of one month from the date of meeting, Memo will be issued.

5. Thus, Total three oral or written remonstrations would be given to erring staff before putting up the case for issuing a memo in the Code of Conduct monitoring committee meeting. Immediate authority (Vice Principal, office superintendent or Office-In-Charge,

Librarian) then Principal and then the complete committee would have a call or face-to-face conversation with the erring member.

6. The agenda of the Code of conduct monitoring committee meeting would be to discuss and arrive at consensus to issue a memo to erring staff as a disciplinary action and to see if any modifications or changes required in Code of Conduct Guidelines.

7. Though the Committee is expected to meet twice in an academic session, the Principal may call emergency meeting whenever required.

8. Reports of the meetings shall be submitted and read in the College Council meetings with prior permission of the Principal.

9. After issuing Memo, if the in-disciplinary action continues, the case of the erring staff would be put up before College Development Committee for further action.

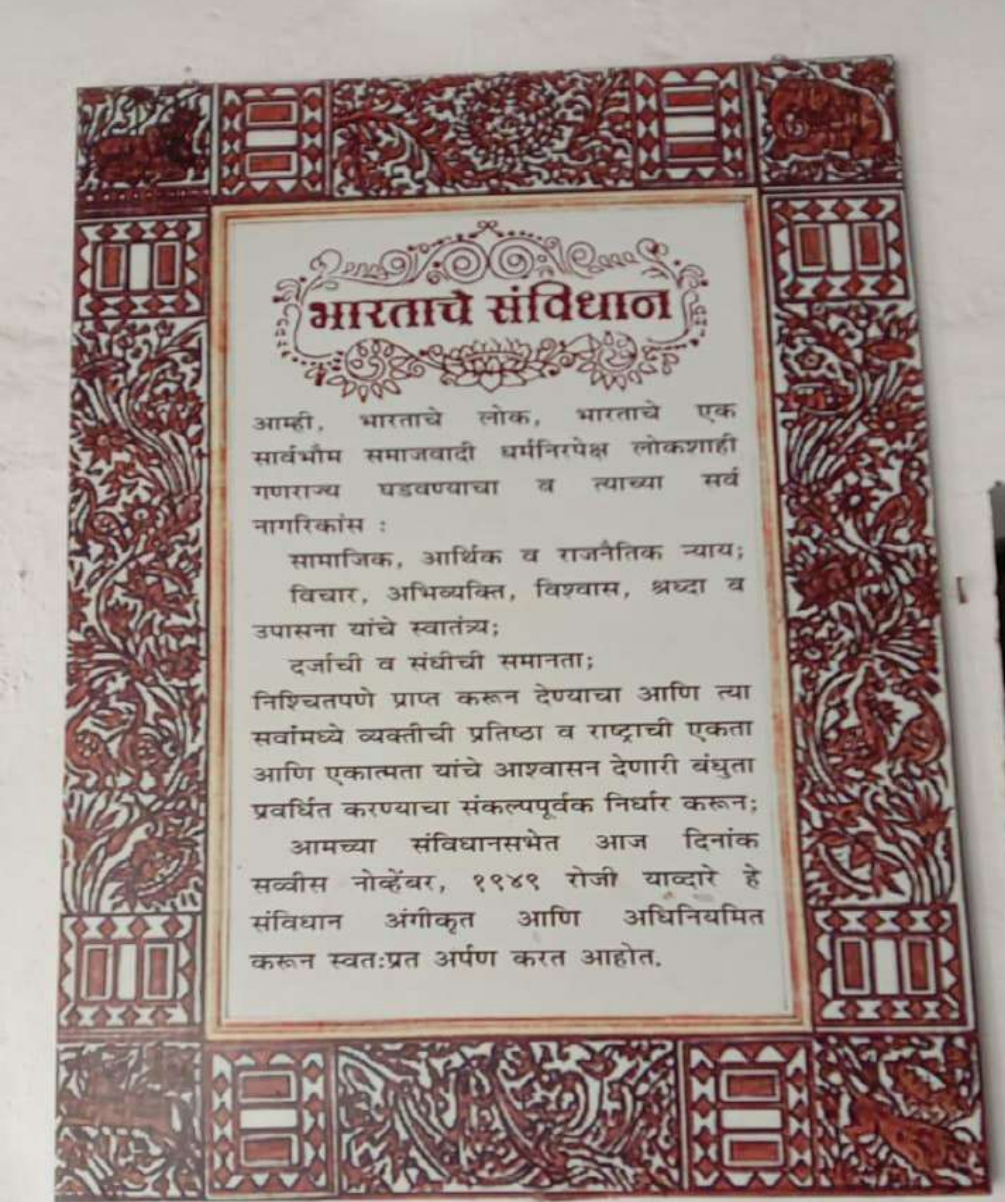

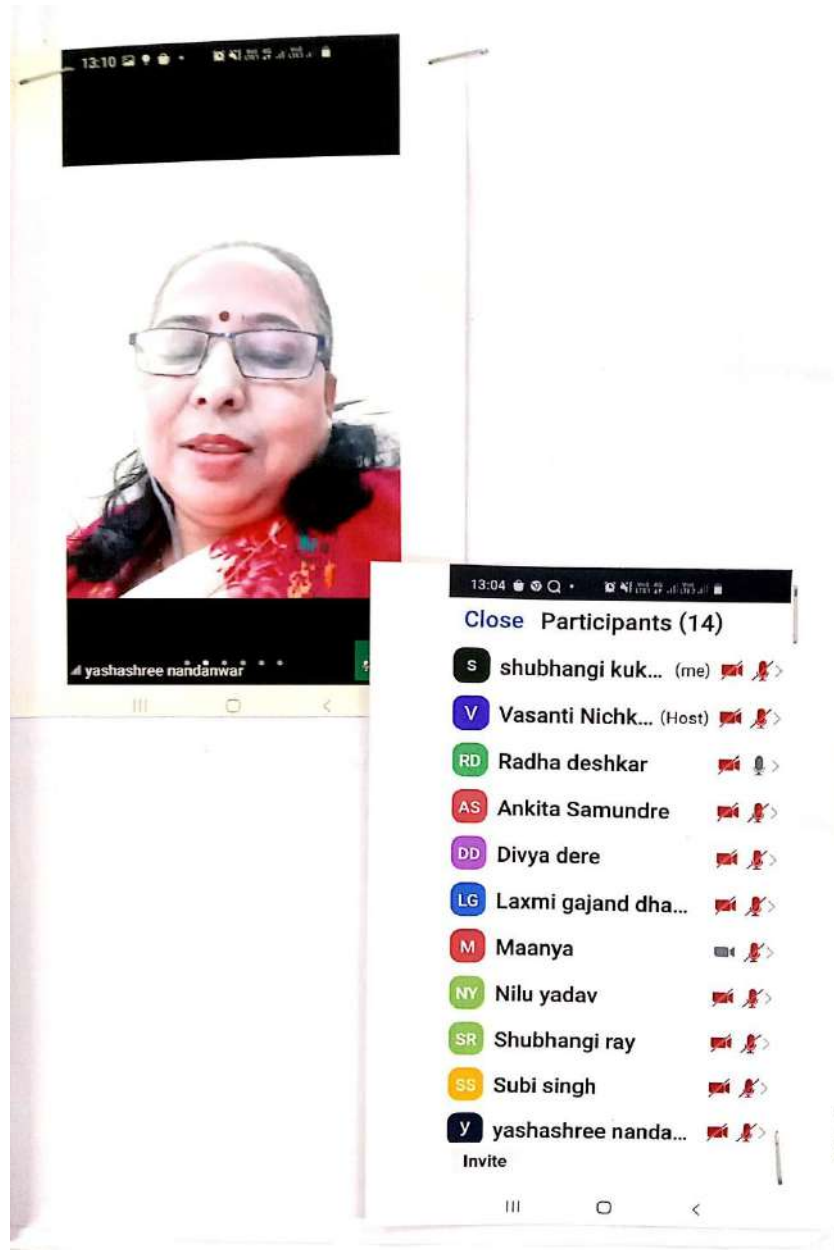

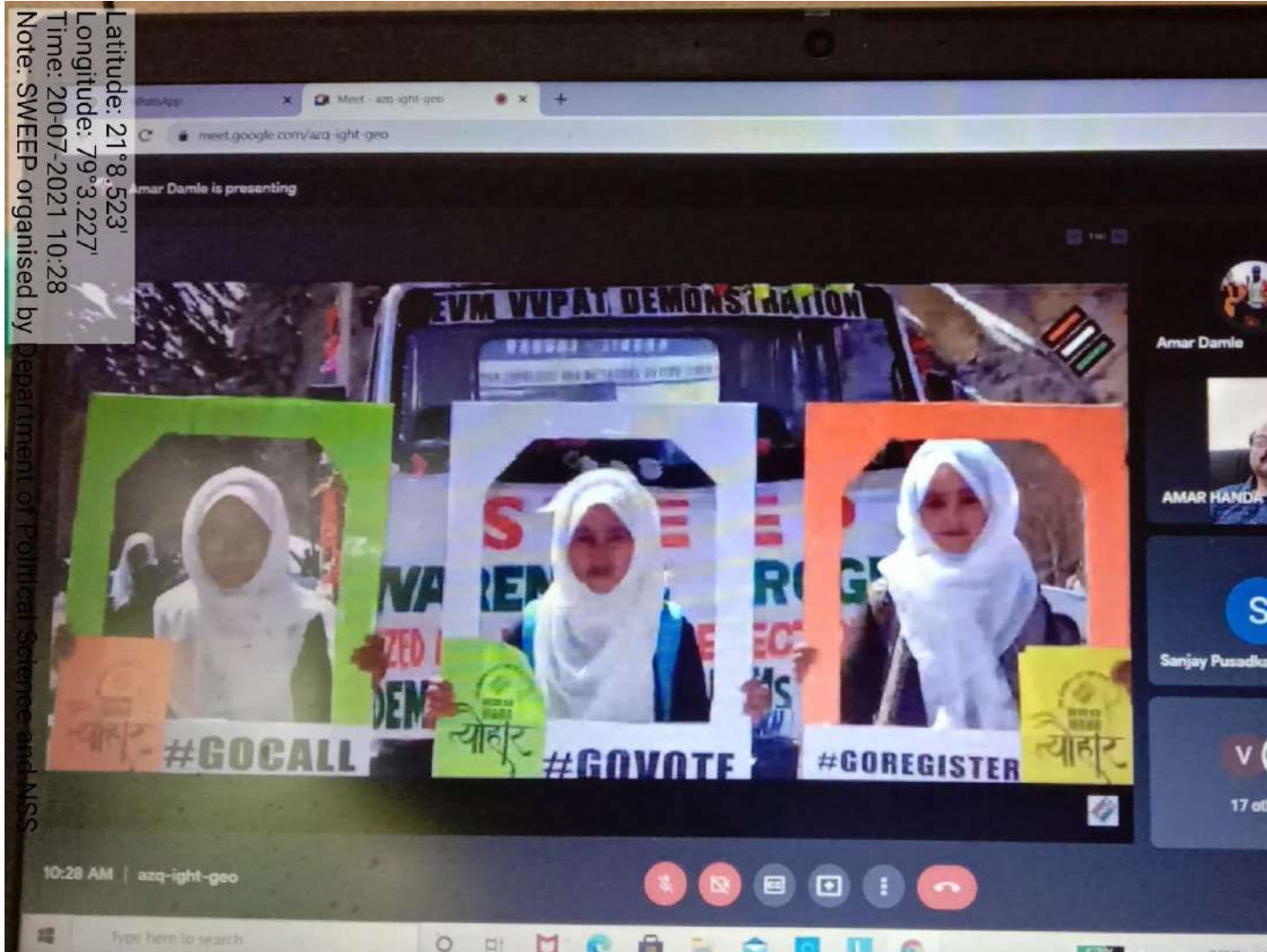
