Response:

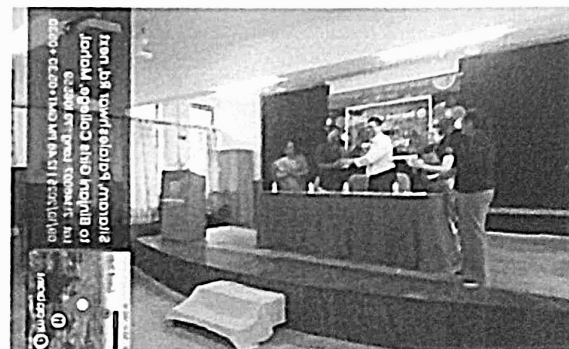
The Guest Lecture was organised for students of B.A. Sem. I, II and III students, who actively participated in this activity.
