
Interest can be defined as something that concerns, involves, draws the attention of or arouse the curiosity about someone or something.

Nevertheless, taken together, a growing body of research using different research methods from different disciplines, including education, sociology, history, psychology, literary history and library, and information science has achieved considerable understanding of the reading interests of readers of the past and present.


Role of Libraries :-
