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# What Persuades Urban Women Electorates To Vote?

# (An Investigative Study of Attributes influencing Urban Women Voters Turnout in Nagpur City) Dr. Charuta V. Joshi

#### Abstract:

In India, out of all the electoral activities, participation of women in voting during elections has shown a significant upsurge. In this context, the present study has been undertaken to identify the dominant factors promoting female voters' turnout in urban areas. Considering demographic structure, male female ratio and female voters' turnout, it is proposed that the study related to female voters turnout of Nagpur City can become representative to evaluate these factors.

The data is collected on the basis of structured questionnaire through survey method. The sample size of 150 female electorates is taken for the study. The data is analysed using factor analysis to identify the significant factors promoting the female voters' turnout, and the results are presented in the form of major determinants which have encouraged women to exercise their voting right.

It is found that the continuous upsurge in the turnout of urban female electorates is the result of influence of multitude of factors. It is concluded that out of these factors, 'Persuasion' for voting is the major determinant contributing substantially in encouraging participation of women in voting activity.

## I. Introduction:

The Constitution of India hailed the principle

of equality in all the walks of life and progress. Resultantly, women in independent India were granted equal rights with men including political rights. The earlier studies (Rai, 2011, 2017) have already shown that out of all the electoral activities major proportion of women participate in voting activity and women voters turnout at national level has shown a significant upsurge. In this context, the present study has been undertaken to identify the dominant factors promoting female voters turnout.

The present study is based on a survey conducted in urban electorates of Nagpur city which is the second capital and the third largest city of Maharashtra. It was pointed out in a study (Chandra and Potter 2016) that conventional studies to locate reasons for low turnout were majorly conducted in metropolitan cities. Identifying this gap, Nagpur city was selected for conducting this study.

#### Women Voters Turnout in Nagpur:

Nagpur is a tier II city with urban population 2,497,870 of which 1,223,732 are females, with the sex ratio of 963 females per 1,000 males. as per 2011 Census. Table 1 below shows discernible increase in the percentage of female voters' turnout from 2009 to 2019 Lok Sabha elections. An attempt is made in this study to assess the reasons which have encouraged women to actively participate in voting activity.
